Our beautiful church is our place of worship, our place of prayer, it where we receive and meet Christ in the Sacraments and it is the place from which our mission begins. Following the lockdowns and the uncertainty of the last few years, let's confidently "Love one another as Christ has loved us" by being at Mass every Sunday, going to Confession once a month, praying for 5 minutes every day and sharing our time, talent and treasure.

Holy Moments. Are you making Holy moments? Have you heard about a Holy Moment? Let's continue to collaborate with God by making Holy moments. The more Holy Moments we make, we shall transform our lives and the lives of those around us.

#### Wednesday 17 May / Thursday 18 May Ascension of the Lord. Holy Day of Obligation

This week, the Church will celebrate the Ascension of the Lord. It is a Holy Day of Obligation. That means we are obliged to be at Mass because of the importance the Church places on this celebration. I do want to encourage you to be generous in being at one of the two Masses. They are: Wednesday 17 May at 2pm in church an Early Vigil Mass with the children from St Mary's Academy Thursday 18 May at 7pm in church

Preparing for Pentecost This year Pentecost will be celebrated on Sunday 28 May. It is the third most important celebration in the Church's calendar and the event recalled in the second chapter of the Acts of the Apostles is depicted in one of the stone carvings in the reredos. One of the oldest prayer customs in the Church, a Novena, or nine days of prayer has its origins in the nine days Our Lady and the Apostles prayed together between the Ascension and Pentecost. Let's take up this tradition this year and pray for our parish that the Holy Spirit will be the instigator and protagonist of our life and mission. Here is a prayer which was prayed everyday by Saint John Paul II.

Holy Spirit, I ask you for the gift of Wisdom to better know You and Your divine perfections, for the gift of Understanding to clearly discern the spirit of the mysteries of the holy faith, for the gift of Counsel that I may live according to the principles of this faith, for the gift of Knowledge that I may look for counsel in You and that I may always find it in You, for the gift of Fortitude that no fear or earthly preoccupations would ever separate me from You, for the gift of Piety that I may always serve Your Majesty with a filial love, for the gift of the Fear of the Lord that I may dread sin, which offends You, O my God.

#### Let's be a parish which treasures Mass, the Blessed Sacrament and receiving Holy Communion

It has been noticeable since the beginning of the pandemic that more people were joining Weekday Mass and it was a significant part of their lives, I do encourage you to be at Weekday Mass in church. This year, since the beginning of Lent, we have been able to have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament almost every day. And as we continue to celebrate the Easter Season, this is a great moment for us to build up both our practice at being at Mass and to build up our knowledge. It would be a great if we all knew the parts of Mass in the same way a musician knows and understands a piece of music or an engineer understands the mechanics of car. Over the next few weeks, I shall reproduce here extracts from a helpful article about

Prayer over the Offerings "Then, the offering: the bread and wine of men. It is very little, but it is accompanied by prayer: 'Lord God, we ask you to receive us and be pleased with the sacrifice we offer you with humble and contrite hearts: and that the sacrifice which today we offer you, O God, our Lord, may be brought to your presence and be made acceptable.' Again, a reminder of our smallness and of the desire to cleanse and purify all that is offered to God: 'I will wash my hands... I have loved the beauty of your house...'.
