

Dear friends, you are doing great! I am incredibly grateful to each parishioner for your daily support of weekday Mass; it is very reassuring when the small eye icon appears on the live-stream feed! During the 1960s at the Second Vatican Council, the Church defined its vision of participation at Mass as, "full, active and conscious". This is what you are doing by tuning in each day. By participating in daily Mass you are becoming familiar with the Church's routine of seasons and the Bible readings used at Mass; you are making daily Mass a major part of your prayer life; you are doing what the Church had in mind all those years ago.

I am very grateful for all the support with maintance and admin; your generous financial support; and, all the other ways you contribute to our parish. I want to thank those who donated the Christmas tree in the church and those who decorated it and set up the Christmas Nativity scene.

From Thursday of this week, the focus of Advent will be the Gospel readings taken from the beginning of Matthew's and Luke's Gospels. They are sometimes called the Infancy Narratives by

the scholars. These Gospel readings form a waiting area before the rest of the Gospels unfold with the mission of Jesus. You will also notice that I have indicated the traditional title for each of these days from the ancient hymn, <u>O come</u>, <u>O come</u>, <u>Emmanuel</u> with the title of each of verses of the hymn which are known as the "O" Antiphons. From Thursday and for the next few weeks, daily Mass will be at the slightly later time of 10am.

As we look ahead to Christmas, let's keep Christ as our focus. Christmas will be different for everyone this year. We can all experience the spiritual riches of Christmas in many ways: please continue to join and support the online Masses; families and individuals can make their daily 5 minutes of prayer at their own Christmas Nativity scenes at home; during your prayer time remember those who have been particulally impacted by the pandemic; and, due to the restrictions, Confession will only be on request and at a social distance; make use of the Act of Perfect Contrition which helps us of us to trust in God's mercy.

During the last week, Pope Francis gave the Church a great gift: a Year of St Joseph, to mark the 150th anniversary of the title we have given to St Joseph: Patron of the Universal Church. This will be a great year-long celebration! I will give more details in the coming days.
