Dear friends, **Let's focus on Holy Week and Easter**. Whether we you are able to be in church or you will be joining us online for the Holy Week and Easter celebrations, it will be great to have your support! These celebrations are the highpoint of the Christian calendar and are the focus of our observance of Lent. Let's remain united and resolute during the final few weeks of this season of God's grace. I hope to confirm the times of the Holy Week Liturgies in the next few days.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation / Confession. In recent weeks a good number of people have been to Confession. It is for everyone's safety that this Sacrament is celebrated in the presbytery car park. If you wish to go to Confession, please be in contact with me directly to make an arrangement.

The Season of Lent continues and let's remain positive! Keep going! Please do not be discouraged if you give up or you are finding the Lenten discipline a struggle this year. Every day is a new start and a fresh resolution can be made. Don't let discouragement stop you.

Be positive! Lent is about a new start in your relationship with Christ and your faith is meant to bring joy and completeness. Your faith is not meant to be a challenge or an endurance test. Belief in God is supposed to be something we are both proud of and are willing to tell others about. Here's a reminder of the three actions of Lent:

Prayer – if you already have a routine of daily prayer, keep going! For Lent, pray for 5 minutes every day.

Fasting – if you have given up chocolate or some other food make a prayer of the sacrifice

Charity – let's try this. When we work together, great things happen! If every parishioner puts aside £1 for each day of Lent that would be £40. If 20 parishioners did this together that would raise £800! If 50 parishioners did this together that would raise £1000! If 100 parishioners gave £40 for Lent that would raise £4000! If we donate this to the Parish SVP Group it can continue to support families and those living alone during this extraordinary time with all the demands it is making There have been more donations during the week. Thank you for your kindness.
