Dear friends,

From Monday evening to Friday afternoon I was at Thornycroft Hall near Macclesfield making a spiritual retreat. It is a requirement for priests in the Archdiocese of Birmingham to make a spiritual retreat every two vears.

There were 6 priests on the retreat: a member of the Society of Pius XI; a parish priest from Liverpool; a priest from Germany; a retired priest from Salford; and myself and one other from the Archdiocese of Birmingham. During the week we were guided to reflect on the Beatitudes (Mt 5 1-12) as the gualities and characteristics of the priest. It was an excellent week and I am refreshed and ready to go.

Archbishop Bernard will be visiting St Mary's on the weekend of 5 and 6 November as part of the wider visitation of all the **Parish Visitation** parishes in the North Staffordshire Deanery. The parishes in our Deanery cover a large area from Clayton and Trent Vale, all the parishes in the Potteries, and several parishes across the Staffordshire Moorlands. The Archbishop will be visiting the parish to meet you. You are his parishioners and it is right that you have the chance to meet with him. The Visitation is not an inspection. It would be good that as many people as possible meet him. The Visitation will be focused on the Diocesan Vision: "We are called to be a Catholic diocese which is: faithful to the mission entrusted to us by Jesus Christ full of missionary disciples who work together co-responsibly in vibrant communities of faith, joyful in their service of God and neighbour." Since the last Visitation in March 2018, there have been huge changes to our lives: the pandemic, the cost of living, the impact of the war in Ukraine, and how the media reports all of this to us. We are to provide the Archbishop with some key parish statistics and your responses to the Synodal Pathway. All of this will need to be in the context of a realistic look at future structures that are viable: there may not be a resident Parish Priest or two Sunday Masses. You will know that there are fewer people coming to church for Mass and in a short time there will be less than 100 priests for the parishes in our Archdiocese. We will not be able to sustain our current practice too far into the future. With this in mind, I am reminded of the parable of the fig tree (Luke 9:6-9)

"Then he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree growing in his vineyard, and he went to look for fruit on it but did not find any. So he said to the man who took care of the vineyard, 'For three years now I've been coming to look for fruit on this fig tree and haven't found any. Cut it down! Why should it use up the soil?' "Sir,' the man replied, 'leave it alone for one more year, and I'll dig around it and fertilize it. If it bears fruit next year, fine! If not then cut it down."

I need your support, friends! Let's be responsible for our part of the vineyard. Let's nurture it. Let's make it grow so that it will produce good fruit. I believe that we can reverse the trend. Let's be bold. Let's show that we want God in our lives. I want to encourage you to these actions:

- Let's return to Mass I want to invite those who have not been to Mass since the beginning of the pandemic; those whose children will be receiving First Holy Communion and the Sacrament of Confirmation next year: let's support the children in the best way by bringing them to Mass!
- Let's return to the Sacrament of Reconciliation. .
- Let's set aside 5 minutes every day to pray. •
- Let's share our time, talent and treasure.

October, the month of the Rosary Almost every weekday we pray the rosary before Mass: the group of parishioners in church are our parish prayer group with people joining online. We pray for a number of intentions: some for particular causes in our parish, others for events we see and hear about in the news. If you can support the daily prayer of the rosary especially during the month of October I am sure that it will strengthen your prayer and faith.

A million rosaries Tuesday 18 October Children are being encouraged to pray the rosary for peace and harmony in the world on 18 October: it would be great if we could join them! Let's take up this initiative and be part of something great!
