Dear friends.

Last Tuesday, Pope Francis announced that next Friday, 25 March, the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord, he will consecrate Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. During one of the apparitions of Our Lady to the children of Fatima on 13 July 1917, Our Lady asked that Russia be consecrated to her Immaculate Heart. Following the Fatima apparitions there have been various acts of consecration to Our Lady. In 1942, Pope Pius XII consecrated the world to Our Lady and in 1952 he consecrated Russia to Our Lady. In 1964, Pope Paul VI renewed the consecration of Russia. This Friday, 25 March, I invite you to come to church for Rosary at 3pm when we shall pray for peace and an end to the war in Ukraine.

I want to invite you to take a full and active part in the Holy Week ceremonies. For the last two years, these celebrations, central to our Christian faith, have been curtailed due to the virus. This year we can celebrate them in their entirety. The 40 days of the Season of Lent prepare us to celebrate these days four days. Here's

Help during Holy Week Can you help with our Holy Week ceremonies, please? The last two years, it hasn't been possible to have all the traditional elements of these liturgies. If you can help, please let me know by sending an email to me at stmary.leek@rcaob.org.uk. Could you assist with:

Thursday 14 April, 2022 - Having your feet washed during the Mass of the Lord's Supper? I pour (warm) water over your feet. Bring your

Friday 15 April, 2022 - Could you help with Reading at the Stations of the Cross for families? The Veneration of the Cross during the Liturgy of the Passion? Holding the Crucifix so that people can make their act of veneration?

Saturday 16 April, 2022 - Lighting candles for the members of the congregation at the Easter Vigil?

A Synodal Parish in a Synodal Church and looking at a new way of doing things. I am incredibly grateful to you for completing and returning the Synod Questionnaires. We are now on the journey! The replies have been collated and will be both available for all and sent to the diocesan office in Birmingham.

Looking ahead it is important that we begin to plan for the next 10 years. It is crucial that we remain united. There is the very likely possibility that you will have to share your Parish Priest with another parish or parishes. This will mean significant changes due to the geographical location of St Mary's to our nearest neighbouring parish.

It is important that we establish our expectations and our boundaries so that we are ready for any significant changes which may be ahead. Have a look at the video which I posted on the Parish Facebook page. Initially, we shall have to establish clear boundaries on the use of the presbytery. Its primary use is a private residence: the word, "presbytery" means the house of the presbyter, the priest; traditionally there would have been two priests and a live-in housekeeper. That is not the case anymore. In the meantime, face to face meetings can take place in the narthex of the church immediately after morning Mass. Meetings can be at other times when key holders are available; this may take some forward planning. Each group will have to ensure that they conduct their own risk assessment before meetings commence and that cleaning takes place after every meeting.

Following the last two extraordinary years, I now need your help more than ever before. Both the Church and the parish need your loyalty. We are not able to go back to how things were two years ago or expect that someone else will be there. Can you help with the following:

- Cleaning the church after Mass on Sundays. There are currently two teams who have been doing this for us since July 2020. Can we make two more teams of 5 people, please? Are you interested in becoming a Reader and being part of a rota for the Saturday Mass?
- > Being part of the welcome ministry (Stewards) on Saturday and Sunday? Are you interested in becoming an Altar Server?
- Opening and closing the church before and after Mass on Saturday and Sunday and setting up for Mass and the smooth running of the sacristy.
- Encouraging your family and friends to return to Mass in church.
- Being part of a winter weather team to move snow and put down grit.
- Could you join the St Vincent de Paul Society or the Knights of St Columba?
- Sweep and Clean on Friday 1 April immediately following Stations of the Cross I want to put up the veils for Passiontide and Holy Week.

Thank you to those people who have been in contact with me and offered their help and support with opening the church on Saturday and Sunday, with joining a rota for Readers on Saturdays, and with restarting the brass cleaning group. I am very grateful to the parishioners who regularly attend daily Mass: a number of people now have their own job to make sure that daily Mass is ready.

Being safe in church while at Mass or other occasions I am very grateful to you for your continuing co-operation with our desire to keep each other safe while in church. I am aware that some people are comfortable with not wearing a face covering, and there are others who are not ready for this. Personally, I am not ready to do without a face covering for my own personal, private reasons. So we ask in church:

- > Use the hand sanitizer when we arrive and when we leave.
- Wear a face covering if you wish; face coverings must be worn when singing.
- > Singing is being introduced gradually; hymn books can be used.
- The church is to be ventilated: It is Leek and it's winter: wear a good coat, please!
- > The cordons on the benches will remain except for one side aisle where the cordons have been removed.
- > Be mindful of others: someone on your bench may be vulnerable or the person on your bench may be returning home to someone vulnerable.
- > Baptisms can take place either during Mass or after Mass; Weddings and Funerals can take place with limited numbers and the other mitigations in place.

Lent at St Mary's 2022 Here is a very helpful summary which I found in another Parish Newsletter: During Lent we do not say the Gloria during Mass on Sundays, nor the joyful word "Alleluia!" At the end of Lent Masses there is the traditional Prayer over the People which has been used during the Season of Lent for many centuries and renewed with the current edition of the Roman Missal. The liturgical colour for vestment is violet expect on the Fourth Sunday of Lent when there is an option for rose coloured vestments. There are no flowers decorating the altar or the lectern, and the statues in the church will be veiled from the fifth Sunday of Lent (Passion Sunday) until Holy Saturday. We shall save it all up and let rip with sound, light and colour at the Easter Vigil when we celebrate the Resurrection. During Lent, let's prepare for Easter and renew our Christian living by

- Going to Mass Let's encourage one another to be at Mass.
- Going to Confession The Sacrament of Reconciliation Confession is celebrated in church on Saturdays 10am to 1030am.
- **Praying for 5 minutes every day** As a parish of prayer let's be united in these intentions: For peace in Ukraine; that we will be stewards of creation; for an end to the pandemic and for the children preparing for First Holy Communion and the Sacrament of Confirmation
- Can you help support these collections during Lent.
