Good Friday Walk of Witness

On Good Friday, Friday 7 April, it will be our turn to lead the annual Walk of Witness in the town centre.

Invitation - try coming to a Weekday Mass in church It is very encouraging to see so many people at Mass each weekend. Every priest and every parishioner in every parish around the world is rebuilding after the lockdowns of the pandemic. If you haven't been to Mass in church for a while, would you consider being at a Weekday Mass when the congregation is smaller than at the weekend for Sunday Mass? There is plenty of room so that you can have a physical distance, some of the benches still have cordons to maintain that distance, there is sanitizer gel, and you are welcome to wear a face covering while in church.

Each parish is at its own stage in this rebuilding phase. Let's continue to be considerate of each other; not everyone is at ease with not wearing a face covering. I have asked that the Eucharistic Ministers continue to use sanitizer gel and wear a face covering for the administration of Holy Communion during Mass and at Eucharistic Services. Let's continue to look after each other by "Loving one another as Christ has loved us."

Sacramental Application Forms These were distributed at our meeting in church last Sacramental Preparation at St Mary's Academy September. Those parents who have not received an application form are asked to see me after Mass. Please ensure these application forms are completed and returned to School as a matter of urgency.

The Sacramental Preparation classes These classes began on Thursday, 12 January and take place in School every Thursday. I will be attending these classes. Please make sure that the consent forms to attend these classes have been signed and returned to School. It is essential that the children attend all Sacramental Preparation Classes. A register of attendance is now taken to support this crucial aspect of spiritual development. I do appeal to the parents and carers of the children preparing for these Sacraments to attend Sunday Mass with your Attending Sunday Mass

child. The Church's obligation to be at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days is not meant to be an additional burden, but to show how, we as Catholics, treasure what is truly important to us. I would like to acknowledge it is good to see that some families are attending Mass regularly. I know that a number of children are part of Associations and Sports' Clubs; regular attendance at meetings and practices for these groups is essential. It is the same for Sacramental Preparation. If you choose not to attend Mass the celebration of the Sacraments for your child will be a shallow occasion. Please do support your child in this important part of their Sacramental Preparation. Our Catholic life observes Friday with special respect because of the Lord's Passion and Death. The devotion to the **Ordinary Fridays** Sacred Heart of Jesus asks us to observe the First Fridays by attending Mass and receiving Holy Communion on nine consecutive First Fridays; it was one of the 12 promises the Lord made to St Margaret Mary during the sixteenth century and has been part of Catholic life ever since. As Catholics we also observe Fridays as days of penance by offering a form of self-denial in thanksgiving for the Lord's gentle mercy and our personal desire for conversion of heart. The Church does not prescribe, however, that fish must be eaten on Fridays. It never did. Abstinence always meant the giving up of meat rather than the eating of fish as a substitute. What the Church does require is that its members abstain on Fridays from meat or some other food or that they perform some alternative work of penance. Here are some practical suggestions for an act of penance on Fridays

- by abstaining from meat or some other food
- by abstaining from alcoholic drink, smoking or some form of amusement
- by making the special effort involved in family prayer, taking part in the Mass, visiting the Blessed Sacrament or praying the Stations of the ▶
- by fasting from all food for a longer period than usual and perhaps giving what is saved in this way to the needy at home and abroad
- by making a special effort to help somebody who is poor, sick, old or lonely
