Dear friends, I wish you a Merry Christmas and promise to pray for you and your families as we gather for Mass this weekend.

An Introduction to the Christmas Season This joy-filled season is one of the highlights of the Church's liturgical calendar, Easter being the highest of highpoints! Together with Easter, Christmas shows our belief in God who intervenes directly in the material world around us: both the birth of Jesus and the Resurrection demonstrate this. Popular culture and modern society "allows" God to be part of ideas and thoughts, but not in the material world. God operates everywhere! If God does not operate in the world around us, then he isn't God. But God can and does operate in our world. By the birth of Jesus and the resurrection, God has ushered in a new creation and given hope to us.

The Season of Christmas has an eight day period which continues the celebration of Christmas day known as an Octave.

There are some key celebrations during the Christmas season: the eighth day of the Octave is New Year's Day and in Church we honour Mary, the Mother of God. This title was given to St Mary during the Council of Ephesus in the fifth century. Friday 6 January will be the

Epiphany of the Lord and is a Holy Day of Obligation. Epiphany means revelation and it is the revelation of the Lord to the Magi or Wise Men which is recalled. There will be two Masses: Thursday 5 January at 2pm at School will be an Early Vigil Mass, and Friday 6 January at 7pm. The final celebration of the Christmas Season is the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord which will be kept on the weekend of 7 – 8 January. This moment is depicted in the stained glass window above the font in our church. Let's continue to...

- ... be at Mass Saturday evening at 6pm and Sunday morning at 10am. For weekday Mass check the Parish Newsletter.
- ... go to Confession Saturday from 10am. If you can't make this, please contact Fr Martin at the presbytery.
- ... pray for 5 minutes everyday There are no rules about prayer. Set aside 5 minutes every day to be in God's presence.

Parish pilgrimage to Knock
