Dear friends, We have started the last two weeks of the Season of Lent. Traditionally, these weeks were known as Passiontide in honour of the Lord's suffering and death. In church, the statues have been covered to add greater solemnity to these weeks. At Mass, the Preface at weekday Masses captures the mood of this stage of Lent, "For through the saving Passion of your Son the whole world has received a heart to confess the infinite power of your majesty, since by the wondrous power of the Cross your judgement on the world is now revealed and the authority of Christ crucified."

Next week, we shall be observing Holy Week. It is the most important week in the Christian calendar and I am keen to invite you to the Holy Week ceremonies and to take a full and active part in them. If you haven't been to Mass in church for a while, it will be great to see you! Let's give the Lord a priority in our lives this Holy Week. Here's what will be taking place and how you can take part:

Saturday 1 - Sunday 2 April Palm Sunday at the beginning of Holy Week celebrates Christ's entrance into the Holy City of Jerusalem. Weather permitting, before both Masses we shall gather in the Avenue to recall Christ's arrival at Jerusalem. Mass on this Sunday is also marked by the proclamation of the Passion from Matthew's Gospel. At both Masses, I would like to invite ...

2 additional readers to proclaim the Passion.

Thursday 6 April Holy Thursday 6pm Mass of the Lord's Supper re-remembers the Last Supper, the Washing of the Feet, the establishment of the Eucharist (Mass and the Blessed Sacrament) and the Priesthood. At the end of Mass, there is a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of repose with watching into the night, recalling Christ's prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane. I would like to invite

- 12 people to have feet washed during Mass

Friday 7 April Good Friday 3pm Celebration of the Passion. This solemn liturgy is characterised by three actions: the proclamation of the

Saturday 8 April Holy Saturday 7pm Easter Vigil. This is known as the "Mother of all Vigils" because of its importance as the most importance act of worship in the Church's liturgical books. There are four parts: the Service of Light, we gather outside the church at the New Fire to bless and light the Paschal Candle and process into the church with lighted candles; the Liturgy of the Word which includes three Old Testament readings, an Epistle and a Gospel reading; next, the Renewal of Baptismal Promises – this is the moment our Lenten programme is aiming at - and the blessing of Holy Water; finally, the liturgy of the Eucharist.
