Holy Week 2022 I want to invite you to take a full and active part in the Holy Week ceremonies. For the last two years, these celebrations, central to our Christian faith have been curtailed due to the virus. This year we can celebrate them in their entirety. Holy Saturday - during the Easter Vigil, there is a custom of removing veils from the statues which have been covered; could you help with unveiling the statues during the Easter Vigil? Please let me know.

A Synodal Parish We are truly a Synodal Parish in a Synodal Church. With your copy of this week's newsletter, I am pleased to let you have a copy of our parish feedback to the Synod. We haven't given all the responses word for word, but a summary which highlights very clearly your replies as part of the Synodal pathway.

You may not have been comfortable with the questionnaire for the Synod. However, you may feel comfortable by indicating your agreement and support with some of the items which were identified in the questionnaire. There are summaries of the responses and if one of these points is relevant to you, please tick or circle the relevant point or points.

One of the questions was: What skills do you have and would be willing to offer and use to help our parish in our mission? There were some great replies. Did you make these replies? If so, could you let me know who you are, please? I want to hear from those who said that they would Read at Mass in church; sing at Mass; be part of the Ministry of Welcome; First Aid Skills; would join the SVP; and, have computer skills. If you could let me know who you are, I will be incredibly grateful!

Being safe in church while at Mass or other occasions I am very grateful to you for your continuing co-operation with our desire to keep each other safe while in church. I am aware that some people are comfortable with not wearing a face covering, and there are others who are not ready for this. Personally, I am not ready to do without a face covering for my own personal, private reasons. So we ask in church:

- Use the hand sanitizer when we arrive and when we leave.
- Wear a face covering if you wish; face coverings must be worn when singing.
- Singing is being introduced gradually; hymn books can be used.
- The church is to be ventilated: It is Leek and it's winter: wear a good coat, please!
- The cordons on the benches will remain except for one side aisle where the cordons have been removed.
- \triangleright Be mindful of others: someone on your bench may be vulnerable or the person on your bench may be returning home to someone vulnerable.
- \triangleright Baptisms can take place either during Mass or after Mass; Weddings and Funerals can take place with limited numbers and the other mitigations in place.
- Lent at St Mary's 2022 During Lent, let's prepare for Easter and renew our Christian living by
- Going to Mass Let's encourage one another to be at Mass.
- Going to Confession The Sacrament of Reconciliation Confession is celebrated in church on Saturdays 10am to 1030am.
- Praying for 5 minutes every day As a parish of prayer let's be united in these intentions: For peace in Ukraine; that we will be stewards of creation; for an end to the pandemic and for the children preparing for First Holy Communion and the Sacrament of Confirmation

At present there are 70 members of the parish 200 Club. Membership is £12 for the year.
