Dear friends, today the Church celebrates the great festival of Pentecost. In the Church's calendar, Pentecost is the third most important day of the year. It is my hope that this weekend is an uplifting occasion for all of us. Let's expect great things of the Holy Spirit who transformed the frightened disciples into courageous heralds and missionaries of the Good News. Let's allow the Holy Spirit to change us, to stir us and awaken us to the things of God.

Here is St John Henry Newman's Prayer to Saint Philip Neri, the founder of the Oratory Fathers, which encourages our devotion to

O my dear and holy Patron. Philip, I put myself into thy hands, and for the love of Jesus, for that love's sake, which chose thee and made thee a saint, I implore thee to pray for me, that, as He has brought thee to heaven, so in due time He may take me to heaven

And I ask of thee especially to gain for me a true devotion such as thou hadst to the Holy Ghost, the Third Person in the Everblessed Trinity;that, as He at Pentecost so miraculously filled thy heart with his grace, I too may in my measure have the gifts necessary for my salvation.

Therefore, I ask thee to gain for me those His seven great gifts, to dispose and excite my heart towards faith and virtue.

Beg for me the gift of Wisdom, that I may prefer heaven to earth, and know truth from falsehood:

the gift of Understanding, by which I may have imprinted upon my mind the mysteries of His Word:

the gift of Counsel, that I may see my way in all perplexities:

the gift of Fortitude, that with bravery and stubborness I may battle with my foe:

the gift of Knowledge, to enable me to direct all my doings with a pure intention to the glory of God:

the gift of Religion to make me devout and conscientious:

and the gift of Holy Fear, to make me feel awe, reverence and sobriety amid all my spiritual blessings.

Sweetest Father, Flower of Purity, Martyr of Charity, pray for me.

Let's be a parish which treasures Mass, the Blessed Sacrament and receiving Holy Communion It has been noticeable since the beginning of the pandemic that more people were joining Weekday Mass and it was a significant part of their lives. This year, since the beginning of Lent, we have been able to have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament almost every day. As we continue to celebrate the Easter Season, this is a great moment for us to build up both our practice at being at Mass and to build up our knowledge. It would be a great if we all knew the parts of Mass in the same way a musician knows and understands a piece of music or an engineer understands the mechanics of car. Over the next few weeks, I shall reproduce here extracts from a helpful article about the Mass.

The Lord's Prayer "Jesus is the way, the Mediator. In him are all things; outside of him is nothing. In Christ, taught by him, we dare to call God our Father — he is the Almighty who created heaven and earth, and he is a loving Father who waits for us to come back to him again and again, as the story of the prodigal son repeats itself in our lives"

The Sign of Peace "Strengthening the bonds of fraternity with all souls helps us to unite ourselves more closely with Jesus in the Eucharist; and thus we also help bring about the concord among all men and womenfor which the Church intercedes in the Holy Mass"

Lamb of God "Behold the Lamb of God ... Lord, I am not worthy ... "We are going to receive our Lord. On this earth, when we receive an important person, we bring out the best — lights, music, formal dress. How should we prepare to receive Christ into our soul? Have we ever thought about how we would behave if we could only receive him once in a lifetime?

"When I was a child, frequent communion was still not a widespread practice. I remember how people used to prepare to go to communion. Everything had to be just right, body and soul: the best clothes, hair well-combed — even physical cleanliness was important — maybe even a few drops of cologne... These were manifestations of love, full of finesse and refinement, on the part of manly souls who knew how to repay Love with love"(from"The Eucharist, Mystery of Faith and Love," Holy Thursday homily of St. Josemaria).
