Dear friends,

Happy New Year! Let's share the blessing of the Old Testament Levites from today's First Reading at Mass at the beginning of the New Year: 'The Lord spoke to Moses and said, 'Say this to Aaron and his sons: "This is how you are to bless the sons of Israel. You shall say to them: May the Lord bless you and keep you. May the Lord let his face shine on you and be gracious to you. May the Lord uncover his face to you and bring you peace." '(Numbers 6:22-27)

I am incredibly grateful for your kindness this Christmas. Thank you so much for the very generous Christmas Offering, the cards and gifts. It was very encouraging to see so many people at the Masses for Christmas Day; it was a great boost for all of us!

At the beginning of the New Year, I would like to share with you some of the statistics of what's happened in our parish over the last year and what will be taking place in the next twelve months. In 2022, there were: Baptisms 10, Receptions into Full Communion (Converts) 3, First Holy Communion 8, Confirmation 5, Marriages 1, Funerals 11. During the next twelve months we have the following to look forward to: there are 7

Baptisms already booked; there are two people receiving instruction ahead of being received into Full Communion with the Church; there is one

wedding booked which will take place during May.

There are 8 children preparing for First Holy Communion and 13 young people preparing for Confirmation – I want to reach out to parents of these children and appeal to you to bring the children to Mass on Sunday. It is incredibly important. Some of the children are in associations and sports' clubs and attending the regular weekly meetings is essential. It's the same for preparing for the sacraments: if you don't bring your child to Mass, the receiving of the Sacrament will not have the value and meaning it should.

Pope Benedict XVI At the conclusion of his homily at the inauguration of his Petrine Ministry on Sunday 24 April, 2005, he made this clear exhortation which, I think, is a positive encouragement to everyone in the Church. Pope Benedict said, "if we let Christ into our lives, we lose nothing, nothing, absolutely nothing of what makes life free, beautiful and great. No! Only in this friendship are the doors of life opened wide. Only in this friendship is the great potential of human existence truly revealed. Only in this friendship do we experience beauty and liberation. And so, today, with great strength and great conviction, on the basis of long personal experience of life, I say to you, dear young people: Do not be afraid of Christ! He takes nothing away, and he gives you everything. When we give ourselves to him, we receive a hundredfold in return. Yes, open, open wide the doors to Christ – and you will find true life. Amen."

Epiphany of the Lord: Holy Day of Obligation In church, we continue to celebrate Christmas. This week we shall celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord which is a Holy Day of Obligation. There will be two Masses to fulfil the obligation: Thursday 5 January at 2pm at St Mary's School, an early vigil Mass will be celebrated: parents of children and parishioners wishing to be at this Mass will be required to sign in at school reception upon arrival; and, Friday 6 January at 7pm in church.

Holy Days of Obligation The Obligation to be at Mass every Sunday and on Holy Days of Obligation is not meant to make life more demanding, but to show how important the celebration of Mass is to members of the Catholic Church. Being at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days is also an act of community with every member of the Church around the world. It would not be Christian to refrain from being at Mass or suggesting that God can be worshipped at home. The correct Catholic action is to be with our brothers and sisters and to worship God in the best way which is the Mass.
