Dear friends, this Tuesday, 11 October, marks the Sixtieth anniversary of the Second Vatican Council. The results of that landmark occasion are evident in our parish today. Mass celebrated in the vernacular; the Church as a beacon of Christ; the use of higher Biblical Criticism; and, the place that the Church has in the modern world. With this week's Newsletter is a short article written 10 years ago for the fiftieth anniversary of the Second Vatican Council and the Year of Faith which was celebrated to mark that occasion.

Archbishop Bernard will be visiting St Mary's as part of the wider visitation of all the parishes in the North Staffordshire Deanery. The parishes in our Deanery cover a large area from Clayton and Trent Vale, all the parishes in the Potteries, and several parishes across the Staffordshire Moorlands. The Archbishop will be visiting the parish to meet you. You are his parishioners and it is right that you have the chance to meet with him. The Visitation is not an inspection. I haven't received details of when the Archbishop will be here. It would be good that as many people as possible meet him. The Visitation will be focused on the Diocesan Vision: "We are called to be a Catholic diocese which is: faithful to the mission entrusted to us by Jesus Christ full of missionary disciples who work together co-responsibly in vibrant communities of faith,

joyful in their service of God and neighbour." Since the last Visitation in March 2018, there have been huge changes to our lives: the pandemic, the cost of living, the impact of the war in Ukraine, and how the media reports all of this to us. We are to provide the Archbishop with some key parish statistics and your responses to the Synodal Pathway. All of this will need to be in the context of a realistic look at future structures that are viable: there may not be a resident Parish Priest or two Sunday Masses. You will know that there are fewer people coming to church for Mass and in a short time there will be less than 100 priests for the parishes in our Archdiocese. We will not be able to sustain our current practice too far into the future. With this in mind, I am reminded of the parable of the fig tree (Luke 9:6-9)

"Then he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree growing in his vineyard, and he went to look for fruit on it but did not find any. So he said to the man who took care of the vineyard, 'For three years now I've been coming to look for fruit on this fig tree and haven't found any. Cut it down! Why should it use up the soil?' "'Sir,' the man replied, 'leave it alone for one more year, and I'll dig around it and fertilize it. If it bears fruit next year, fine! If not then cut it down.

I need your support, friends! Let's be responsible for our part of the vineyard. Let's nurture it. Let's make it grow so that it will produce good fruit. I believe that we can reverse the trend. Let's be bold. Let's show that we want God in our lives. I want to encourage you to these actions:

- Let's return to Mass I want to invite those who have not been to Mass since the beginning of the pandemic; those whose children will be receiving First Holy Communion and the Sacrament of Confirmation next year: let's support the children in the best way by bringing them
- Let's return to the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- Let's set aside 5 minutes every day to pray.
- Let's share our time, talent and treasure

A Synodal Parish in a Synodal Church: Why go to Confession? In our Synodal responses, there was an overwhelming request for encouragement for the Sacrament of Confession. Here is the first part of an article, "Why go to Confession?" What is Confession? Why is sin so harmful? What's needed for a good Confession, and why do we ask for forgiveness from a man and not directly from God?

Why go to Confession? Confession is a sacrament instituted by Jesus Christ to forgive sins, when he said to his apostles: "Whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; whose sins you retain, they are retained" (Jn 20:23). We go to confession because the new life given to us by God in baptism can be weakened and lost through sin. This is why Christ wanted the Church to continue his work of healing and salvation through this

Through the sacramental absolution of the priest, who acts in the name of Christ, God grants the penitent forgiveness and peace, restores the grace by which we live as a child of God and can reach heaven, eternal happiness. (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1420-1421; 1426; 1446)

We pray for a number of intentions: some for particular causes in our parish, others for events we see and hear about in the news. A million rosaries Tuesday 18 October Children are being encouraged to pray the rosary for peace and harmony in the world on 18 October: it would be great if we could join them! Let's take up this initiative and be part of something great!
