Dear friends, this weekend, we welcome the students from Painsley Catholic College to our Saturday evening Mass! As part of our reflections for the Synod, we identified that we want to build relationships with both St Mary's Academy and Painsley Catholic College, and in particular, the students, pupils and their families. We believe that there is a great working relationship between our schools, homes and parish community: let's encourage this relationship and let's encourage our young people.

This weekend, Archbishop Bernard has sent a Pastoral Letter to every parish in the diocese, asking that Parish Councils be established. Here at St Mary's, I am incredibly grateful for our Parish Council.

Meeting Fr Martin after Mass I am glad to meet parishioners after Mass. The Sacristy is a busy place especially after the weekend Masses with altar servers, their relatives, children attending Sacramental Preparation, and volunteer cleaners. For those who wish to see me and to ensure confidentiality, I ask that you wait in the benches by the Confessional. I will be happy to see you once the live-stream has stopped and I have seen the children attending Sacramental Preparation. If this is not a convenient time, contact me in the usual ways. Thank you for your help in this matter.

Filip Gronkiewicz We congratulate Filip who has been accepted to begin training for the Priesthood in the Archdiocese of Birmingham. Let's continue to support Filip both with our prayers – let's wrap him in a blanket of prayer, and by encouraging him.

Let's continue to pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life: let's double our efforts, asking God for another vocation. Please sign the prayer calendar at the back of the church. Please take with you some prayer cards from the table at the back of the church.

Holy Week I am looking forward to celebrating Holy Week and all the liturgies and devotional activities associated with this high point of the Church's calendar. The weeks of Lent have been preparing us for Holy Week, and in particular, the Easter Triduum, the days which include Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday; the season of Lent has been acknowledging the divine dignity which God gave us at our baptism.

We are now in the last two weeks of Lent which used to be called Passiontide. This period of Lent is marked by the custom of covering the crucifixes and statues; there is a special Preface before the Eucharistic Prayer; and, there is a growing focus on the Lord's Passion and Suffering.

Next weekend, 23- 24 March, we celebrate Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. The two Masses next Sunday will begin with the Commemoration of the Lord's entrance to the Holy City of Jerusalem with the blessing of Palm Crosses and a procession. Please do take a Palm Cross next weekend and place it in a prominent place in your home.

Thursday 28 March Holy Thursday, the Mass of the Lord's Supper.

6pm Mass of the Lord's Supper followed by prayer at the Altar of Repose This Mass is celebrated in the evening to correspond with the Biblical accounts of both the Passover in the Old Testament and the Lord's Supper in the Gospels. At the Last Supper, Christ instituted both the Sacrament of the Eucharist (the Mass) and the Sacrament of Holy Orders.

During the Mass of the Lord's Supper, the priest washes the feet of 12 parishioners, copying the action of the Lord. At the end of the Mass, the Blessed Sacrament is taken to the Altar of Repose where it will be kept during the Easter Triduum season. Those who attend the Mass of the Lord's Supper are encouraged to remain in church in prayer at the altar of repose.

Friday 29 March, Good Friday.

10am Stations of the Cross for children and young people 12noon Walk of Witness from the Nicholson Memorial 3pm Solemn celebration of the Lord's Passion 7pm Stations of the Cross

"Good" comes from an old English word meaning, "Holy". Today, the Sacrament of the Eucharist (the Mass) is not celebrated. The Solemn Celebration of the Lord's Passion is celebrated during the

afternoon to correspond to the timings given in the Gospels. It begins in silence and with the priest laying prostrate on the floor of the church in front of the altar as a sign of honour to Christ and a reminder of his Ordination when he lay prostrate as a sign of self-giving and trust in God. The three parts of the Solemn Celebraion of the Lord's Passion include, first, the Liturgy of the Lord which has the Passion according to St John as its centrepiece. Next, the Veneration of the Cross: two parishioners bring the cross to the front of the church in procession. This procession is punctuated by three moments of veneration before all the members of the congregation come forward to make their own personal act of veneration. Finally, there is the administration of Holy Communion. The Good Friday liturgy concludes in silence with all the members of the congregation genuflecting to the crucifix.

Saturday 30 March is Holy Saturday 10am Devotions to Our Lady of Sorrows 230m Blessing of Food, Swierconka 730pm Easter Vigil

Sadly, popular culture has renamed this day. Mass is not celebrated until the Easter Vigil. During the day, the Church is at prayer at the Lord's tomb. We shall host a traditional Polish custom, the Blessing of Food, Swierconka, families prepare food baskets. The items in the baskets have a religious significance: the baskets are lined with linen or lace napkins and Easter evergreen; there are decorated eggs representing Christ's resurrection; bread representing Jesus the Bread of Life; cooked lamb representing Jesus the Lamb of God; salt for purification; horseradish for Christ's sacrifice; and, ham for joy.

The evening's Easter Vigil is the Church's most important liturgical action: everyone should be there! The four parts of the Easter Vigil are about the four foundations of the Christian life: the service of light and the lighting of the Easter candle is about the Resurrection; the Liturgy of the Word; the renewal of Baptismal promises; and, the liturgy of the Eucharist.

Sunday 31 March is Easter Sunday! 10am Easter Sunday Mass 130pm Polish Mass

Let's all be together for Easter Sunday Mass. I have an Easter gift for you! I want us to be together to encounter the Risen Lord at Easter Day Mass. I want our belief and our participation at Mass to take off!

Easter Duties The Church wants us to benefit from the spiritual effects of Christ's suffering and resurrection and calls us to go to Mass, receive Holy Communion and go to Confession during the period of Lent and Easter.

Devotions to Our Lady of Sorrows From next Monday, 18 March, we shall use the Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows before Mass until Easter. I have been very encouraged by the number of people who have bought the special rosary beads for this devotion; I have had to reorder twice! One parishioner said to me the other day when asking me to bless their rosary beads, "This devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows is a mother's prayer!" And, I must agree! The seven sorrows of St Mary do connect with real life situations which mothers, fathers and priests connect with. There are more on the piety stall at the back of the church.

Bene Merenti Presentations Following the recent news that Pope Francis has honoured three of our parishioners with the Bene Merenti award, I am now glad to let you know that Canon Paul McNally, the Parish Priest of Holy Trinity, Newcastle, and Episcopal Vicar for this region of the Archdiocese will present the awards at Mass on Sunday 19 May. I am looking forward to a great parish celebration which we can all enjoy.
