On Thursday afternoon we had our latest Parish Council Meeting. For while our Parish Council Meetings have included representatives from both of our Catholic Schools: St Mary's Academy and Painsley Catholic College. Following the lockdown period of the pandemic and the decline in Mass attendance it is more important than ever for us as a Parish and Schools and families and individuals to work together and encourage one another to be part of the church and being at Mass, going to Confession, praying for 5 minutes everyday and sharing time, talent and treasure. Let's remained united and resolute. Let's continue to build up the Church and encourage one another in the life of faith.

Safeguarding Sunday 18 – 19 November Safeguarding Sunday is an awareness-raising campaign organised by Christian Safeguarding Charity Thirtyone:eight. We will be marking this in our parish. In doing this we will be joining thousands of other churches across the UK to share this message and demonstrate unity. We believe that safeguarding is an outworking of our faith in a loving and just God – the God who calls us to speak up on behalf of those who cannot speak for themselves and to defend the rights of the vulnerable (Proverbs 31:8). Safeguarding is so important to us all and a crucial part of our faith and Christian mission. Today is about recognising and celebrating the important work of safeguarding within our parish and wider communities. The role of the Parish Safeguarding representative is to be a point of contact within the parish regarding safeguarding matters; to work with the Parish Priest and group leaders to ensure all things we do in church are safe and ensure everyone has the right checks in place to work with children and adults at risk. By working together and all being aware that safeguarding is important, and we all have a role to play, we can ensure our churches and communities are a safe and welcome place for all, especially those who have not felt this in the past.

Blessing the church musicians and singers This weekend is the nearest to the liturgical memorial of St Cecilia, 22 November, the patron saint of church music and it is appropriate that during the two Masses this weekend, the musicians and singers are blessed as they minister to us. The music for the celebration of Mass, the other sacraments and other devotions is not intended to entertain us, but it is included to serve the Church's liturgical worship. One of the stained glass windows depicts Saint Cecilia: do have a look for it!

Saturday 25 November 615pm Mass with Painsley Students and their families I would like to invite the young people who are students at Painsley Catholic College to Mass at 615pm on Saturday 25 November. It will be great to see you! It would very good to see the young people who have received the Sacrament of Confirmation in the last three years so that they are encouraged in their life of faith. After Mass on that day, the Painsley Lourdes Group will sell cakes to raise funds for their pilgrimage during May next year.

Winter Weather Team I am asking for help ahead of any winter weather and for a team of volunteers to move snow and apply grit in the car park and along the two walkways to the church. Many of the people who used to do this aren't able to help any longer. If you can help, please let Fr Martin know.

Sacramental Preparation Sacramental Preparation is underway. The children preparing for First Holy Communion and Confirmation have their second Mass Attendance and Activity sheet. I want to encourage parents and carers to continue to bring their children to Mass.

New Altar Servers Our new altar servers have made a great start and are doing great. Tuesday 26 December is the Feast of St Stephen the First Martyr and the patron saint of Altar Servers. I ask that the new altar servers attend Mass every weekend from now until then so that during Mass on 26 December they can admitted into the Guild of St Stephen and receive their Altar Serving medal. It isn't a badge to acknowledge several weeks of altar serving, it is the badge of the members of the Altar Serving Guild.

Getting ready for Advent at St Mary's

Let's read St Luke's Gospel for Advent! Luke's Gospel has 24 chapters. This may seem a daunting task, but it isn't that difficult. It would be a great united action for everyone in our parish to read one chapter of Luke on the 24 days before Christmas. I have ordered some large print copies of Luke's Gospel which includes a very good introduction. If you would like a copy they are £4.99 each and are available at the Piety Stall at the back of the church. When reading St Luke during Advent, I suggest that you keep a personal reading journal. In your journal note down the phrases that

Jesus says and the images which have been recorded by the Gospel-writer which inspire, encourage and challenge you. Make a note of what inspires, gives courage and makes a demand.

The image on this year's card is that of the scene of the stable in Bethlehem which has been taken by one of our parishioners, a keen and talented photographer.
