Dear friends, this weekend, the Church marks the new liturgical year with the First Sunday of Advent. Earlier in the week, I noticed this very helpful summary of this holy Season, "The whole story of Advent is the story of how God can't be kept out. God is present. God is with us. God shows up – not with a parade but with the whimper of a baby, not among the powerful but among the marginalized, not to the demanding but to the humble."

As this Season of Advent is a new year, it is appropriate to make new year resolutions. Could you be at one weekday Mass during the week? Could you be in church on a Saturday morning from 10am for Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament? Could you help the parish SVP group with their regular contact with elderly and isolated parishioners?

This year the Season of Advent is only three weeks. Let us make the most of this preparation for Christmas by being at Mass including weekday Mass, going to Confession, making time for personal daily prayer, and sharing our time, talent and prayer.

Year of Prayer, 2024 The beginning of the new Church year and the Season of Advent marks the beginning of the Year of Prayer which is uniting Catholics around the world to prepare for the Jubilee Year 2025. Pope Francis has an audacious vision for this year long preparation. His vision is, "I would greatly desire that we devote 2024, the year preceding the Jubilee event, to a great "symphony" of prayer. Prayer, above all else, to renew our desire to be in the presence of the Lord, to listen to him and to adore him ... In a word, may it be an intense year of prayer in which hearts are opened to receive the outpouring of God's grace and to make the "Our Father," the prayer Jesus taught us, the life programme of each of his disciples"

It was great to see them. They read, lead the Bidding Prayers and did the Offertory Procession. They were great ambassadors for Painsley!

After Mass, they had a cake sale to raise funds for their pilgrimage to Lourdes during May next year. You helped them to raise a great £112. The students have asked me to pass on their thanks to you for supporting them. They will have a very positive experience of the worldwide Church while they are in Lourdes.

In your journal note down the phrases that Jesus says and the images which have been recorded by the Gospel-writer which inspire, encourage and challenge you. Make a note of what inspires, gives courage and makes a demand.

Christmas Prayer Tree This year we will have prayer tree located near the Nativity Scene. It's purpose is for parishioners to write the name of a deceased loved one onto a wooden angel decoration and hang onto the Christmas Tree in their memory. I am grateful for the suggestion as well as donations of the tree, the decorations and the wooden angels.

Christmas Nativity Scene This year marks the 800th anniversary of St Francis of Assisi establishing the first Christmas Nativity Scene at Greccio near Rieti. On 29 November, 1223, St Francis was returning from Rome having received confirmation of his Rule to establish the Franciscan Order from Pope Honorius III when he stopped at Greccio. He was reminded his visit to the Holy Land and the similarity of the geography around Bethlehem. We are told from the Franciscan archives that 15 days before Christmas of 1223, St Francis asked a local man to help him bring to life the Christmas Nativity Scene. On Christmas Day of that year, Franciscan Friars and people gathered together. When St Francis arrived, a live nativity had been arranged and the priest celebrated Mass.

The Christmas Nativity Scene has been set up in the Market Square. Please do go and look at it and say a prayer there. Don't walk passed. Make a Holy Moment by visiting the Crib.

Please do set up a Christmas Nativity Scene at home. Make it a family activity. Be sure to make a daily Holy Moment of praying for your family at the Christmas Nativity Scene.
