**Parish Census** It is time to update our parish records. This weekend please collect a census form. In this census we want to update our records so that we have an accurate picture of our parishioners, the ecclesiastical groups they are members of, the connections to schools and other skills that they may be able to help in our parish.

Let's be ready for Lent This Sunday is the second Sunday before the Season of Lent and in the traditional Church calendar was known as Sexagesima Sunday, meaning the sixtieth day before Easter. This short pre-Lent season is intended to prepare us, the members of the Church, for the Season of Lent. In the past, when this Season was kept, it would have looked and sounded like Lent: the priest wore purple vestments at Mass, there were no flowers in church, the Gloria was omitted from Sunday Mass; the only exception, there was no fasting. Today, we can use this time to prepare our Lenten observance. Lent is not intended to be a spiritual assault course. The Season of Lent prepares us for the Easter Triduum and renews our personal confidence in the dignity of our Christian living.

Let's go to Mass this Lent! The Season of Lent is a great time to go to Mass in church. Let's use the six weeks of Lent to go to Mass and revive our connection to Christ in this sacrament. Let's do something extra instead of giving up. Here are the Mass times for the beginning of Lent:

Ash Wednesday is Wednesday 14 February. Our parish Mass will be at 7pm on that day. Let's get it in our diaries and make a good start to this holy season.

Sunday Mass at St Mary's: Saturday evening at 615pm; Sunday at 10am.

Weekday Mass at 10am (check the Newsletter and Facebook page for any changes)

Pray! Keep going with your 5 minutes of prayer every day! If you miss a day, make sure you start again the next day. No one can fail in prayer. We are observing the Year of Prayer at the request of Pope Francis. Please pray the Lord's Prayer in unity with our brothers and sisters around the world. **Fast!** Making a sacrifice is customary during Lent. Instead of fasting from chocolate, give up being impatient or quick tempered. Try something extra: praise, encourage, support.

**Charity!** This year we are having a raffle to raise funds for our parish SVP Group so that they can continue their mission to send meals to the lonely and isolated parishioners.

## Here are some of the other activities taking place this Lent:

**Confession – the Sacrament of Reconciliation** Confessions are celebrated on Saturdays at 10am. If you can't make this, please do call to make another arrangement.

Stations of the Cross Sundays at 4pm followed Benediction and Fridays at 10am.

Walk with Me – the prayerbooks for this Lent are at the back of the church and this time the focus for the daily reflections is the Lord's Prayer and the Year of Prayer. Please do take your prayerbook. There's a suggested donation of £1.

**Dynamic Catholic** At critical times throughout Salvation History, God's people have been invited to consecrate themselves. We are at one of those critical times in history, and consecrating ourselves, our families, our country, and indeed, the whole world to the Eucharist may make all the difference. Year of Prayer We are well underway for the Year of Prayer and the spiritual preparation for the Jubilee Year next year. I encourage you to keep up your 5 minutes of prayer every day! Keep going! No one can fail in their prayer. If you can, please do join at 930am on Sunday morning at St Jospeh's chapel, Morning Prayer from the Divine Office, the Church's Official Prayer book. Let's work together to pray the Church's Official Prayer.

**Ordinary Fridays** Our Catholic life observes Friday with special respect because of the Lord's Passion and Death. The devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus asks us to observe the First Fridays by attending Mass and receiving Holy Communion on nine consecutive First Fridays; it was one of the 12 promises the Lord made to St Margaret Mary during the sixteenth century and has been part of Catholic life ever since. As Catholics we also observe Fridays as days of penance by offering a form of self-denial in thanksgiving for the Lord's gentle mercy and our personal desire for conversion of heart. The Church does not prescribe, however, that fish must be eaten on Fridays. It never did. Abstinence always meant the giving up of meat rather than the eating of fish as a substitute. What the Church does require is that its members abstain on Fridays from meat or some other food or that they perform some alternative work of penance. Here are some practical suggestions for an act of penance on Fridays

by abstaining from meat or some other food

by abstaining from alcoholic drink, smoking or some form of amusement

- by making the special effort involved in family prayer, taking part in the Mass, visiting the Blessed Sacrament or praying the Stations of the Cross
- by fasting from all food for a longer period than usual and perhaps giving what is saved in this way to the needy at home and abroad
- by making a special effort to help somebody who is poor, sick, old or lonely

Administration of Holy Communion Due to the prevailing risk, the norm for receiving communion remains on the hand. For those who wish to receive Communion on the tongue, please come to the Altar at the end of the congregational procession as the Minister of Holy Communion will need to sanitise his/her hands after every person receiving on the tongue.
