Dear friends, the Synod is underway!

On Wednesday of last week (4 October) Pope Francis opened the Synod of Bishops which is discussing the Church: the Synodal Church.

Pope Francis understands the Church as a Synod that is we – all the members of the Church – walk together. When we walk together we have to change: first, to change the speed at which we are walking; and, to listen carefully to each other.

During 2021 every parish, chaplaincy and Religious Community in the Catholic Church was asked to contribute to the Synod which has just started. For us, here at St Mary's, we identified two overwhelming priorities. First, encouragement for the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession). The second for young people in our parish.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated every Saturday from 10am. If you are unable to make this time, please call me to make another arrangement. By the Confessional there are copies of a guide about the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Please do take one.

We are reaching out to encourage young people. We continue with a weekly Mass in school; we have monthly Family Mass; we had a recent Parish Council Meeting at Painsley demonstrating our parish's wish to include young people – our next Parish Council Meeting will be at St Mary's; I have had constructive conversations with the Scout Leaders; another Scout Group has approached me to ask if the Cubs can complete their Faith Badge at St Mary's; and, I have been in a fruitful conversation with the Chaplain at Leek College.

These two issues are raised at every Parish Council meeting because they are the ways we have discerned that we should be walking together as a Synodal Parish in a Synodal Church. Let's keep walking ... together!

During the period of the lockdown as a parish, we also considered the characteristics of living our faith. We had four actions:

Sunday Mass; Monthly Confession; 5 Minutes of prayer everyday; and, sharing our time, talent and treasure.

During this time we defined our parish mission as "Love one another as I have loved you."

It has been carefully considered that the Synod on the Synodal Church begins now: on the day of St Francis of Assisi, the Pope's Patron Saint and the saint who was asked to rebuild and maintain the church; the readings at Weekday Mass are currently taken from a period of Old Testament history when the people of God was rebuilding after the time of exile: we have had our exiles including the pandemic, the wars in the world, the financial uncertainty; and, the Gospel reading at Mass this weekend (Mt 21:33-34) which proclaims our life of faith.

We are a parish that makes Holy Moments. A Holy Moment is when I listen to God and do his will. Holy Moments include calling a friend or a neighbour; responding to a plea for help; being patient; resisting temptation and putting God first in our daily routines and activities.

For the next three weeks, the Pope with bishops, priests, and lay people will meet in Synod. They will discuss three topics:

Communion that radiates: How can we be more fully a sign and instrument of union with God and of the unity of all humanity? **Co-responsibility in Mission**: How can we better share gifts and tasks in the service of the Gospel?

Participation, governance and authority: What processes, structures and institutions in a missionary synodal Church? These topics are exactly what we experience as a Parish. Let's keep walking together!

Weekly celebration of Mass in the Polish Language Beginning on Sunday 29 October at 1pm, the weekly celebration of Mass in the Polish Language will recommence. I am grateful to Fr Jacek for his understanding and co-operation.

Pope Francis publishes a brand new Apostolic Exhortation, "Laudate Deum" (Praise God) On Wednesday 4 October, Pope Francis published his latest Apostolic Exhortation which is a sequel to the 2015 "Laudato Si". In this letter, The Holy Father addresses the situation of climate change in "Laudate Deum" because "a human being who pretends to take the place of God becomes the worst danger to himself" (LD 73)

October the month of the Rosary Pope Francis has asked that together we pray the Rosary for peace in Ukraine and other areas of the world affected by war. Let's continue to pray for the Synod at the Vatican, for the those in our parish who have stopped being at Sunday Mass and Confession, for the children and young people preparing for the Sacraments, and for the sick and housebound.

Do you have a Red Box for Missio? On the weekend of 22 – 23 October, the Church observes World Mission Sunday. On that weekend, our Masses will be Special Masses for the Evangelisation of the Peoples.

Year of Prayer, 2024, Preparing for the Jubilee, 2025. I am planning to distribute a prayer card with our parish's intentions in time for the beginning of Advent.
