Year of Prayer, 2024 We are now in the year long spiritual preparation for next year's Jubilee Year. Let's be part of Pope Francis's bold vision of a "Symphony of Prayer". What an great thing to be part of the whole Church, around the world, dedicating this year to prayer! It is good to be part of a worldwide movement which is doing good. I encourage you to set aside 5 minutes of prayer every day. Pray the Lord's Prayer as the Pope has asked to. Pray for our parish prayer intentions:

- the children and young people of parish preparing for First Holy Communion and Confirmation;
- for the sick and housebound parishioners;
- for families:
- for parents as the first teachers of the faith;

- for children suffering from sickness;
- for peace and justice.
- Please do take your prayer card and let's be a parish joining in the great symphony of prayer!

## Let's wrap in a blanket of prayer

- The children who will be baptised in the coming weeks; let's encourage their families also!
- The children preparing to make their First Holy Communion three children will receive their Holy Communion on Saturday 15 June during a special Mass at 11am; there are two more children who will make their First Communion on other occasions.
- The young people preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.
- The young people sitting public examinations at this time.
- Let's keep Filip in our prayers as he prepares to go the seminary. What a blessing that our parish will be sending a young man to the seminary to begin formation for the priesthood! Let's pray for more vocations! If every parish sent one man to the seminary there is the great possibility of a priest in every primary school, secondary school, hospital, prison and more priests in parishes.

Ordinary Fridays Our Catholic life observes Friday with special respect because of the Lord's Passion and Death. The devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus asks us to observe the First Fridays by attending Mass and receiving Holy Communion on nine consecutive First Fridays; it was one of the 12 promises the Lord made to St Margaret Mary during the seventeenth century and has been part of Catholic life ever since. As Catholics we also observe Fridays as days of penance by offering a form of self-denial in thanksgiving for the Lord's gentle mercy and our personal desire for conversion of heart. The Church does not prescribe, however, that fish must be eaten on Fridays. It never did. Abstinence always meant the giving up of meat rather than the eating of fish as a substitute. What the Church does require is that its members abstain on Fridays from meat or some other food or that they perform some alternative work of penance. Here are some practical suggestions for an act of penance on Fridays

- > by abstaining from meat or some other food
- > by abstaining from alcoholic drink, smoking or some form of amusement
- > by making the special effort involved in family prayer, taking part in the Mass, visiting the Blessed Sacrament or praying the Stations of the Cross
- > by fasting from all food for a longer period than usual and perhaps giving what is saved in this way to the needy at home and abroad
- > by making a special effort to help somebody who is poor, sick, old or lonely

Consecrating our homes, families, school and parish to the Sacred Heart of Jesus For many generations it was usual to see a large picture of the Sacred Heart in a Catholic home: it was part and parcel of our Catholic way of life.

The devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus spread across the Church in response to and to combat the heresy of the Jansenists. The Jansenists rose to prominence especially in northern Europe during the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries. Their message was uncompromising and rigid. The believed - falsely - that we relied on grace alone in the same way that the Prostestant reformers had promoted, and that God limited his mercy to a few people. In response the devotion to the Sacred Heart has a much more positive and approachable appreciation for God, His grace and His mercy. Personally, I like the practical application of Sacred Heart devotion which includes the assurance that Christ is close to us by promising that he can establish peace in our homes, that sinners will be sure to find an ocean of infinite mercy, that priests will be able to help the most hardened sinners to convert, and, my favourite, that Christ will bless every place where a picture of his Sacred Heart is shown and honoured.

We have had prepared images of the Sacred Heart - it is a photograph of the stained glass window in memory of our former Parish Priest, Fr Anderson. There are large copies which you can display at home which has a prayer of consecration. There are smaller cards also. Please do take them! It would be great that every home and family dedicates itself to the Sacred Heart during this month. If you want, please take a family selfie and we can post them to the Parish Facebook page.

Altar Servers For the enrolment of new altar servers, I ask that the new altar servers attend Mass every weekend from now until 13/14 July so that they can be admitted into the Guild of St Stephen and receive their Altar Serving medal. It isn't a badge to acknowledge several weeks of altar serving, it is the badge of the members of the Altar Serving Guild. Additional altar serving - it would be great to see a good number of our altar servers on Saturday 15 June at 11am for First Holy Communion and Saturday 6 July at 11am for Confirmation.

Saturday 29 June 615pm Family Mass with Painsley Students We invite the families of the young people attending Painsley Catholic College in Cheadle to their Family Mass to celebrate Ss Peter and Paul. Last year, 13 young people received the Sacrament of Confirmation and now we only see 1 or 2 regularly at Sunday Mass. We are missing the young people!

Remember St Mary's in your Will As a parishioner or as a visitor to our beautiful church, a building of prayer and history, we ask you to consider leaving a legacy to St Mary's church when you are making your will. Administration of Holy Communion Due to the prevailing risk, the norm for receiving communion remains on the hand. For those who wish to receive Communion on the tongue, please come to the Altar as the end of the congregational procession has received Communion, as the Minister of Holy Communion will need to sanitise his/her hands after every person receiving on the tongue.
