Dear friends, today (Sunday) during Mass we shall welcome into our parish family two new parishioners. We speak of them being Received into Full Communion with the Catholic Church. During Mass they will profess the Creed, be Received, receive the Sacrament of Confirmation and make their First Holy Communion. I hope this is a good reminder for all of us that alongside the content of faith in the Bible, the Church's Tradition and the official Magisterium of the Church, faith is an action which we practise; we speak of practising our faith. We are the practitioners, the people of faith. So, for all of us: cradle Catholics and those who have been received into Full Communion may this Sunday's Mass revitalise and reinvigorate the practise of the faith in these four actions: Being at Sunday Mass every week, Going to Confession once every month, Praying for 5 minutes every day, Sharing our time, talent and treasure

World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly This Sunday, the Sunday nearest to the celebration of Ss Joachim and Anne on 26 July, the grandparents of Jesus, is the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly. This annual World Day was instituted by Pope Francis in 2021. Grandparents have a great role to encourage and inspire children as they grow in faith. Keep making a positive contribution to the faith development of your grandchildren. There are copies of the Pope's message to Grandparents and the Elderly at the back of church.

The final meeting of the Visitation I am incredibly grateful to everyone who attended the final meeting of the Visitation which took place at St Gregory's, Longton, on Tuesday evening. During the meeting a number of recommendations were made for a number of the parishes in our deanery. There are copies of the report at the back of the church.

I want to increase the number of children taking part in Mass Children and young people have a central place in the story of Christ; there are over 30 events in the Gospels which include either Jesus as a child or another young person with a central role. Let's encourage the children and young people in our parish to take roles especially as Altar Servers, Readers and Singers.

Altar Servers I would like to invite those children in Year 3 who have recently made their First Holy Communion and any child in school Years 4 and above who have made their First Holy Communion to become Altar Servers. The ministry of the altar server helps both the priest and the people to take part in the celebration of Mass. To be an altar server requires being able to learn new skills, to adapt to new situations, to be part of a team and to give a good example to everyone in church.

The summer holiday has begun The long awaited summer holidays are now here! If you are having a holiday this year, I hope that you have a good break and rest. During this holiday period, let's remember not to forget God. Please do make sure that you can get to Sunday Mass and to make time for personal prayer.

The Synodal Church Since 2012, at the invitation of Pope Francis, you have been invited to be part of the Synod Process. It began with parish level discussion, then to diocesan, national and continental (for us, European) level. And every continent submitted its work. Remember, we are a universal Church. It would be very surprising if every part of the world expressed the same concerns and areas of interest. We continue with our parish priorities: encouraging the Sacrament of Reconciliation – Confession: this is celebrated in church on Saturday morning from 10am; the Confessional is now in use for this; or, alternatively, please be in contact if you want to go to Confession. During the week, I will be meeting the leaders of the St Mary's Scouts to discuss ways in which the young people can be part of our parish.

Sacramental Preparation for 2024 The compulsory meeting for parents of those children in School Year 3 or School Year 6 at Saint Mary's Academy will take place at 4pm on Thursday 14 September and will take place in church. During this meeting, parents will be asked to provide details of their child's baptism by Friday 29 September, 2023. During the next academic year children preparing for the Sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation will have to attend Mass in church on Sundays in four blocks of six consecutive weeks. Each child will receive their own Mass attendance and activity card for each of the four blocks of six Sundays; there will be a short activity to be completed. At the end of the task, the Mass attendance and activity card will have be stamped by the priest. The four blocks of six weeks will coincide with the school term; holiday time will not be affected. There will be more about this in the parents' meeting on Thursday 14 September. Parents should be aware that Sacramental Preparation will take place in school on Thursdays beginning in January, 2024. Sacramental Preparation for Confirmation will take place during lunch time. Sacrament Preparation for First Holy Communion will take place after school. A register of attendance will be taken each week. I would also like to inform parents of children who will be starting school Year 3 in September that the parents of children aged 7 years old and over wishing to be Baptised must attend a course of instruction. If your child was baptised in another Ecclesial Community ie the Church of England your child can only be admitted to the Sacraments if they are aged 7 years or over, attend an additional course of instruction with their parents, and attend Mass every Sunday. Parents are asked to contact Fr Martin and attend Mass.

Holy Days of Obligation Let's continue to prioritise Mass on Holy Days of Obligation. The purpose of being at Mass on Holy Days is not to make life more demanding, but to show our devotion to the Lord. The next Holy Days of Obligation are:

Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Monday 14 August 2pm Early Vigil MassTuesday 15 August 7pm Mass All Saints Tuesday 31 October 2pm Early Vigil Mass Wednesday 1 November 7pm Mass
