Dear Friends.

Today, Sunday, we welcome Barbara and Derrick from St Edward's parish on this Exchange Sunday which is part of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Last Monday, we launched the daily prayers at Trinity Church. I am very grateful to those who came along in support on that occasion and have been supporting the daily prayer meetings there. Later today, the annual United Service will take place at 4pm at St

Sunday of the Word of God. This weekend, the Catholic Church around the world observes the Sunday of the Word of God. This annual observance was instigated by Pope Francis in September 2019 and first celebrated two years ago.

Here is a suggestion to mark this day at home;

On the Sunday of the Word of God, the entire family gathers around the main table in their home, where the crucifix, a picture of Our Lady, a candle, and the Bible are placed. They recite certain prayers before listening to the Word of God. They can read one of the Bible readings proclaimed at Sunday's

Mass. Once this has been read, the family can share with one another about what they have just read. Here are some helpful prompts to that sharing:

What part of the passage struck me the most and why?

Which person in the biblical story do I identify with?

What behaviour or situation caught my attention?

Did I experience any emotions during the reading? Which ones and when?

How does this passage relate to my life?

Do I feel inspired by the words I have heard?

St Nicholas Owen: Could we have a parish pilgrimage to Harvington Hall in Worcestershire? On 23 January the Church in the Archdiocese of Birmingham celebrates the memory of St Nicholas Owen. He lived during the 16th and 17th century and was a skilled carpenter. To show his devotion to the celebration of Mass and the life and ministry of priests, he built hides in the homes of Catholics with the purpose of protecting priests during the times of religious persecution. In our diocese, we have Harvington Hall near Kidderminster which has been a place of pilgrimage for a number of years as it was a location for priests to hide. Among those priests was St John Wall, also a martyr of the 17th century. If you would like to make a visit to Harvington Hall later this year, please let me know and I would be happy to make the arrangements.

Pope Francis wants us to be a Synodal Parish The Pope wants us to walk together, focused on Christ and knowing that we are valued members of the Church each capable of contributing to its life and mission. Every parish in the Church is being asked to take part in this process. This is, arguably, the most significant move made by the Church to discern the Holy Spirit's work among us since the 1960s. I have almost completed a questionnaire which I would like you to complete. There are no right or wrong answers and no one will be judged; you are unique, and we want to know your thoughts and ideas. To be a Synodal Parish in a Synodal Church is to talk about being part of the Church and listening to each other about being members of the Church: what nourishes and feeds our belief; what do we do well as a parish; what are we proud of; and what would we do together? For me, I want this to be a meaningful and relevant for every parishioner: young and old, convert to Catholicism, lapsed and the faithful.

Staying safe in church Both the number of vulnerable people attending Mass and the number of people who attend Mass and return home to vulnerable relatives, have deemed it necessary to continue with the cautious approach which is already in place. Here is a summary of the Covid safety rules.

- The Government's revised Covid guidelines mean that in churches we must carry on as we have been, sticking carefully to the precautions and remembering that no-one should be doing anything in church or for church that they consider too risky for them.
- Face coverings are now mandatory
- Sanitise hands on entry and exit
- Keep a 1m distance if you can
- Ventilation is important. Please bring a coat!
- Lateral flow testing: please test yourself each week so that if you know you have the virus you stay at home
- Feeling ill: if you feel unwell, please stay and home and do not risk passing on the virus to others
- Vaccination: HAVE YOUR JABS! This keeps others safe too and is not just about the individual who is vaccinated. We Christians have a duty to take care of others and to neglect any of these ways of reducing infections is to neglect our neighbour. We are all in this together.

## The Celebration of the Sacraments

Confession is available on Saturdays from 10am - 1030am. Confession will be celebrated face to face in the narthex and by appointment. Please bring a face covering.

We raised £121 on the raffle and £83 with the Christmas cards. We also received very generous cash donations for the live-streaming equipment, a brand-new computer and Wi-Fi extender for which I am very grateful to the individual donors.

Repairs to the church and Sweep and Clean Over the last two weeks repairs have been carried out to the rose window in the west gable where the scaffold was established in November. Since then, some masonry has been replaced and repointed. There have been repairs to the sacristy roof and the possible causes of the leaks into the sacristy and over the altar of St Joseph. Thank you for your patience over the last months. I have been informed that the repairs should be complete by 21 February. Towards the end of that week, on Friday 25 February at 2pm could we have two Sweep and Clean teams: one inside the church and another to clean the car park, driveway and avenue? In the church, a large amount of dust has settled on the arches and under the rose window. If we could get the scaffold set up and clean these hard-to-reach places, I would be very grateful.
